Year 1: Training Needs Analysis (1)

- •All of the communities have certain unique needs, either in terms of training subjects or the nature of the how the training is provided
- The subjects that were most requested across communities for training were
 - Data Staging and Movement
 - Workflow Orchestration and Execution
 - AAI principles



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Year 1: Training Needs Analysis (2)

- Common theme: the need to target training at two audiences, each of whom would benefit from a particular type of training:
 - a broad audience of end-users who would benefit from less detailed, awareness creating training in order to help them understand the benefits that EUDAT services could provide, and to make best use of them, and
 - a smaller audience of implementers and developers who would benefit from more detailed, EUDAT-specific training



Training Needs Analysis (3)

 There was an interest in EUDAT-specific training events, but training collocated at existing community events was particularly valued, especially for the awareness creating training

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Current Plans & Ongoing Activities

- 5 Community Training Events
 - Focusing on Initial Communities
 - but with a view to involving new communities
 - Co-located with community events/conferences
 - Expected to be "higher-level" (with an appeal to a broader audience in the community) and highlight to people the potential benefits of using a collaborative data infrastructure
 - ...but with the precise target-audience and course content tailored and agreed in conjunction with a community representative



Planned Training Events

- We also want to do cross-community technical training
 - This has to be fairly technical to be useful
 - Until the technical details of the infrastructure become very well defined, it's difficult to "train"
 - What we probably need to do in the mean time is to bring people together to share expertise
 - We hope to do this (face-to-face) in Q2 or Q3 this year
 - We also are considering video-conference/webinar seminars in technical areas
